Frequently Asked Questions

Q: What is War at the Shore Baseball Tournaments?

A: In 2001, a group of dedicated individuals with common interests created a youth travel baseball tournament. The tournament started small.. Today, War at the Shore Baseball Tournaments serves hundreds of teams with Spring, Summer and Fall baseball tournaments.

Q: What is the mission of War at the Shore Baseball Tournments?

A: Our primary focus is the development of tournaments that allow teams of all skill levels to compete. We will provide the best learning atmosphere, the best competition, and the most fun the game of baseball has to offer to our tournaments participants while maintaining the integrity of the game of baseball.

Q: What age groups does War at the Shore Baseball Tournments offer?

We offer 7u,8u,9u,10u,11u,12u 13u, 14u, 15u, 16u, JV, & Varsity. 11u teams will have the option to play on the 46/60 or the 50/70 diamond. 12u teams will play on the 50/70 diamond in the Spring & Summer. All teams will play the following years age group in the fall. For example a 12u team from the summer will have the option to play 13u 60/90 or 13u 50/70 in the fall.

Q: How do I know what team age my team will be?

Players must be born on or after May 1st. For 2025 the ages cutoffs are:

05/01/06 18u	05/01/12 12u
05/01/07 17u	05/01/13 11u
05/01/08 16u	05/01/14 10u
05/01/09 15u	05/01/15 9u
05/01/10 14u	05/01/16 8u
05/01/11 13u	05/01/1 <mark>7</mark> 7u

Tournament age is the age the player has attained prior to May 1 of the playing season. Example: A player who is ten years old at the beginning of the season but will turn eleven on or before April 30 shall be classified as tournament Age 11. Players may not "play up" (participate) in competitive tournaments higher than their tournament age level, regardless of their skill level.

School grade exemptions: For 13u and older **ONLY TWO** school grade exemptions per team will be allowed for players of the same graduating year who were born prior to May 1^{st} . However, those players must be born on/after January 1 to be eligible.

Q: How do I rate my team?

Elite Rating: You are a strong "A" level team and can challenge any team with confidence.

A Rating: You are an "A" level team. You have an All-Star Caliber team. You are competitive with most A teams.

- B Rating: You are a "B" level team. You have some strong players and some weak ones.
- C Rating: You should be a weaker "B" level team or a stronger "C" level team. You have at least one pitcher that is decent.
- D Rating: You should have a very weak team. D rated teams would be compared to rec teams.

If you won your division or went the season with less than 2 losses you should bump your rating up. We will consider your prior records (if available), and location when creating divisions. Rating systema are not perfect; but do even out the competition.

Q: How many players should I have?

A: Most teams operate with at least 12 players. If you have any less you may find it difficult to field a team.

Q: Is there mandatory playing time rules for games?

A: There are no mandatory playing time rules.

Q: Do I need a home field?

A: No, War at the Shore will supply one...

Q: Does the tournament supply a uniform?

A: No teams are responsible to supply their own uniforms.

QFri games start at 530 -6PM. Weekend games can be at any time.

How to use a Tournament Credit:

Tournament credits can only be applied to the tournament fee.

Tournament credits are valid for one year from the original event date, they are non-refundable for cash and non-transferable outside of your organization.
